# Yorkshire Synod Elders' Conference – 17 April 2021 Summary of ideas submitted to 'Action Ideas' account during the day (full transcript below)

#### Getting your church on board

- Beverley held a Green day invited stalls an energy company came and did a green audit offering actions - large and small.
- Ilkley have a film club, shown 'An inconvenient truth' followed by discussion (other films available)
- Keep pressing on affirming to congregations without scaring / boring that this is serious.
- Hold a congregational green audit

## **Church buildings and land:**

- We should be looking at our buildings and the costs of maintaining them not only financially but also in relation to the climate
- When doing building work etc, challenge builders re materials used.
- Hold an energy survey
- Some churches have flat roofs. Could put plants on them for insulation and to reduce energy usage.
- Could allotments or produce grown in church gardens contribute to foodbanks?

#### **Post Covid church:**

- Embed ideas relating to climate change in all our planning for the future.
- need to be flexible as we move forward remembering to include environmental issues in our thinking. Look to the ecumenical possibilities which could mean the better sharing of resources
- Zoom will feature in the post Covid church. Holding events and meetings like this online will reduce travelling.

### Thoughts for synod:

- It would be good to share experiences of contacting our MPs with one another across the Synod, for mutual encouragement and support
- Synod Ecology group to promote local churches/areas/M&C Groups to promote and organise lobbying their MPs
- It would be good for Synod to form action groups for different issues. We heard how Rachel Mander can help with lobbying MPs. We concentrated on climate change, which is fundamental to our survival, but there are a lot of other important issues too. We can often feel powerless alone so it would be good to work together.
