## **Lay Preachers Planning Group news**

#### **Exploring the upcoming lectionary readings together**

Facilitated by Kath in the morning and Jill at night, this will be a time for participants to look together at the lectionary readings for 13<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> June and 4<sup>th</sup> July in preparation for leading worship on those Sundays.

The second is on **Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> June** at 10.30am – 12.00noon and repeated 7.30pm -9.00 pm on Zoom. Facilitated by Rod this will be a time for participants to look together at the lectionary readings for 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> July & 1<sup>st</sup> August in preparation for leading worship on those Sundays.

This time the group are trying a repeat of the morning session at night to assess how this is works for you all. As previously these sessions will be participative rather than "expert led" by an outside speaker and the links will be sent to to all lay preachers nearer the dates.

## **Safeguarding News**

#### Verifier training.

DDC (Due Diligence Checking) – the company that provides the service to process the DBS checks on behalf of the URC are offering training slots to those local church officers who are verifiers/document checkers for their church and would like to have an input on how to process the checks. It would also benefit verifiers who may need an update in how to use the system.

There will be a URC Safeguarding Officer present at each session to assist and answer any questions. The dates for these training slots are:

- 10<sup>th</sup> June 2021 10am to 11am
- 10<sup>th</sup> September 2021 4pm to 5pm

• 5<sup>th</sup> July 2021 – 7pm to 8pm

• 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2021 – 9.30am to 10.30am

#### Trustee training.

There is also specific training being provided for Trustees of local churches within the Synods to understand your safeguarding responsibilities. This training is being provided online by Farrar & Co, a firm of solicitors from London who provide safeguarding advice and assistance in all aspects of safeguarding matters. This training is being provided to all churches throughout the Northern, Yorkshire, North Western and Merseyside Synods via funding from the Synod Safeguarding Development Fund.

This is a 2 hour training session which as well as providing vital guidance, allows you to take part in discussions and look at case studies to help your understanding of your role as a Trustee for your church.

The following aspects will be covered

- Why safeguarding matters to the URC
- How to ensure effective safeguarding arrangements are in place for your church
- The Elders duties as Trustees
- How to spot, deal and report with a serious incident

The training will be delivered via Zoom and the dates for the sessions are

- Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021 10.30am to 12.30pm
- Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021 1pm to 3pm.

### **Property News**

As I mentioned on the front page, the Synod team are keeping a close eye on any developments that may arise in the run up to the magical date of June 21st. At the heart of this is a desire on our part to understand fully the implications any changes will have on the regulations associated with buildings. Jane, our Property Officer is available to advise on the best course of action when it comes to how we begin to reopen, but as mentioned above, please keep a close eye on the Government's websites. I have commented in previous Briefings that there is some flexibility in the rules surrounding the meetings of charitable organisations. This means that in certain circumstances church or trustee/Elders meetings can take place in person. Details can be found here Coronavirus (COVID-19) guidance for the charity sector - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk). It is a rather complex page on the Government's website, but it may allow churches to hold Annual Meetings as the meeting fulfils the charitable objectives of the church. However, do bear in mind that you will still have to be Covid secure, following track and trace guidance, be able to ensure appropriate social distancing and have an up-to-date Risk Assessment. #### **URC Buildings Forum Steering Group**

The URC Buildings Forum Steering Group is planning some more conferences in the wake of the successful Buildings Forum held back on April 19<sup>th</sup>. They have agreed to hold future conferences around three times each year and the next one is to be held on **21**<sup>st</sup> **July 2021** from 11.30am to 1.00pm.

This conference will explore the **Vision and Mission Context for URC Buildings and Assets**, including whether we need a building to be 'church' in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century? For this part of the conference, they are pleased to be able to welcome Martin Haywood, the convenor of the Mission Enablers Network and the Southern Synod Mission Officer. They hope also to hear from two separate places of worship about how that have creatively used their buildings. One in a rural community and the other in a multi-cultural community.


## **Children and Young Peoples News**


