
The Briefing – Number 63 29th July 2021

Dear Friends,

This week, dare I say, has been a relatively quiet one in certain quarters. There are the usual rumblings and grumblings in Parliament regarding the final lifting of self-isolation (due to come into effect on 16th August) and the number of questions coming into the office regarding the overall lifting of restrictions and the move to self-regulation hasn't caused too much stress. Despite this seemingly lack of movement the engine room that is the Synod Office and the staff there are still keeping a close eye on any developments and as usual are ready and willing to help in any way they can. As a reminder, please consult both the URC advice, ably encapsulated in **URC Synod Moderators' New Freedoms, Same Responsibilities: Synod Moderators' advice to congregations (urc.org.uk)** as well as the **URC's main Advice to churches about coronavirus from the United Reformed Church** pages.

Sadly we are experiencing a bit of technical difficulty with the relevant Yorkshire Synod page at the moment. It's not the whole site so my advice is to click here Yorkshire Synod (urcyorkshire.org.uk), find the bit near the bottom that looks like this image to the right, fill it in and you will get a weekly update as to everything that is new. In time this weekly update will replace the weekly Briefing. It won't happen immediately although from early September the plan is for the Briefing to be published fortnightly. Don't keep this little snippet of information to yourself – tell your friends, your church members and your congregations as a whole. There's a whole array of things to help, guide and inform you, not only about the URC but about how we can become a Jesus centred people.

I hope those quarters that were not quiet this weekend were in your church buildings. If you were one of those folk who I spoke with last week you may have been asked what the first hymn would be now that we can enjoy congregational singing (behind masks of course). I



was hoping to be able to sing "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing"; I didn't get that one, but boy was I happy to clear the tubes with "To God be the Glory".

So as we travel through August keep the doors open and the welcomes warm. Our responsibilities are still the same as they have been throughout the pandemic and I hope that these are at the forefront of our collective minds. Regularly review your Risk Assessments, remember those who remain clinically vulnerable or anxious and encourage everyone to continue the hygiene routines we have got used to so that we can show love to others through minimising risk to their health. As well as the links noted above the latest Government advice can be found here Coronavirus: how to stay safe and help prevent the spread - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk). Whatever a church decides to do Synod will support it in that decision. All that we advise is that you be responsible and that you respect the wishes of those who are not yet prepared to embrace the apparent freedoms Step 4 offers. Similarly, if churches do feel that they are not yet prepared to offer what is now allowed and need support then Synod is there for them. So in the meantime keep referring to the websites here guidance on what you can and cannot do and Find out what the rules are and hopefully they will have been updated on the Government website.


