

Crochet Triangular Shawl pattern

This method produces a shawl which is a triangular half of a traditional crochet "granny" square. **(Photo on left)**

200 - 300 gm DK yarn, with 2x50gm contrast for stripes., if desired. 4.50mm crochet hook. You can either work stripes of contrasting colour as shown in one photo, or use a random coloured yarn. There are some lovely colourways available from Hayfield and King Cole. And if you use an acrylic yarn you will be sure it will be easier to look after for the person you give it to.

Row 1. Ch 6, join in circle with sl. St (slip stitch)

Row 2. Ch 3, and into 6ch ring work 1 tr (treble), 1ch, (chain) 3tr, 2ch, 3tr, 1ch, 2tr.

Row 3 Turn - 3 ch, work 1 treble into top of 1st treble, 1ch, work 3 tr into next 1ch space, 1ch, work 3tr, 2ch, 3tr into 2ch space (for corner of shawl), 1 ch, work 3 tr into 1ch space, 1ch, work 2 treble into top of 3ch at the end, working in stripes of contrasting yarn if you wish. (About 35 or 36 repeat rows) Work 1 row dc all round

For a more open, airy shawl work (1tr, 1ch, 1tr) instead of 3tr. You may be able to work up to 39 or 40 rows, leaving some for the dc edging. (Photo on right)



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
