Dear Friends,

The past fortnight has been a whirlwind. I have had some time off with my family – 4 days in a windy Whitby, the government has altered the restrictions regarding self-isolation and mask wearing, and the continent of Europe is again convulsed by aggression and war. Indeed, the last week itself has been full of activity as the preparations for our Synod meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> March at St Andrew's Skipton are coming together.

I think we need to just pause and pray. Below is a prayer that can be found at Prayers for Ukraine -United Reformed Church written by Rev Dave Herbert, Moderator of Northern Synod. # **Lifting of Covid-19 Restrictions**

As you will know the government has lifted the restrictions surrounding the wearing of masks and the compulsory self-isolation regulations if one contracts Covid-19. This doesn't mean that the pandemic is over as there are still many people contracting the virus. In fact the advice that is being offered is that you still need to remain vigilant and that if you feel as though it is the right thing to do you may retain the measures you have had in place over the past months. Certain things will no longer be happening, such as the use of the QR posters we have had on display and the track and trace scheme we have all got used to. ## **Spring Synod Meeting**

The advances in what we can now do through the technical team within Synod and the foresighted decision of General Assembly in respect of the validity of hybrid meetings means that this Spring not only shall we be gathering in person we will simultaneously be able to welcome those who dial in via our dedicated interactive digital facility.

The papers for the meeting will be sent out very soon – in the main digitally as this is how we intend to proceed in the future, but there is the opportunity to receive printed copies if you contact the office as soon as possible. The conference will focus on the increasing significance of the 'local' in action for change. During the pandemic, the local has taken on a renewed importance, and the needs, characteristics and opportunities in our communities have been seen in different ways. The local is playing a new role in

When accessing the portal please ensure you are using a modern browser, such as Firefox, Chrome or Edge and that you keep it regularly updated. Older versions are unsupported, and you may experience issues.
