West Park URC Harrogate host a Gilbert & Sullivan service



On August 14th at West Park URC in Harrogate, a service was held as part of the Gilbert & Sullivan Festival which is an annual event in the town. A congregation of over 100 came from across the country and an augmented choir was directed by West Park's organist David Wilberforce who organised the service. It was led by Rev Dr Ian Bradley, Emeritus Professor of Cultural and Spiritual History at The University of St Andrews and featured a number of Sir Arthur Sullivan's hymn tunes including *Bishopgarth and St. Gertrude* (Onward Christian Soldiers). Rev. Bradley told the congregation that the origin of St. Gertrude was somewhat unusual. Sullivan was staying at the home of Gertrude Clay-Ker-Seymer in Hanford, Dorset when he composed the tune and decided on the name there and then.

The singing as one might expect was of the highest order and a most uplifting and memorable service was enjoyed by all.

Heritage Open Days

The Yorkshire Historic Churches Trust has been in touch inviting churches to get involved in an exciting new initiative - **Yorkshire Churches Day (YCD)**.

Their vision for Yorkshire Churches Day is to have one day a year when all places of worship in the region open up and showcase the history and heritage found inside their buildings. It is a wonderful opportunity to show off the value of the many historic religious buildings in Yorkshire both as places of worship and important centres for the local community.

The aim of the day is to encourage everyone to visit their local church even if they have never stepped foot inside a church before. It will be a day for those who are curious about the history and heritage of their local surroundings and to find out how our church buildings are still active places of worship.

This year Yorkshire Churches Day is being run in partnership with the Heritage Open Days (HOD) initiative on **Saturday 10th September**. Heritage Open Days is England's largest festival of history and culture, when thousands of people come together to celebrate their heritage, community and history.

To take part, a church needs to register on the HOD website Heritage Open Days by 31st July, open up on 10th September and explore missional and fundraising events to hold on the day. Safeguarding News

Update in relation to Safeguarding Foundation Training

In line with other denominations and private and public sector bodies, the foundation training package in relation to safeguarding is now available to be completed online via an e-learning package.

Some of you may ask what e-learning is?

Well, e-learning is a type of learning conducted digitally via electronic media, typically involving the internet. It can be accessed via most electronic devices including a computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone, making it a versatile and easy way for people within the local churches to learn whenever and wherever they are.

What this means for local churches is that everyone can access the training wherever and whenever they want to do so. You don't have to make yourself available for a specific time and date, you don't even have to complete it in one go. The package allows **you** to take as much or as little time as **you** need and allows **you** to learn at your own speed.

The training has been completed by URC training and development officers including Matt, the Synod's Safeguarding Officer. The package is easy to follow and understand and at the end of the training you are given the option of obtaining a certificate as well as ensuring you won't need to attend any other URC foundation training for a further three years.

Accessibility

All you need is a connection to the internet and a device of your choice. It works best with something that has as large a screen as possible, but please use whichever device is available to you and best suited to how you want to view the information.

The package is accessed by the URC Learning Hub which you can get to by copying and pasting the following into your browser - https://www.urclearninghub.org.uk/

Once there you will be asked to sign in and create a username and password, exactly like you would anywhere else and then you can access the training package.

The package autosaves so when you feel you have had enough training for one day, you can stop and it will save your progress where you finished – so you don't have to start all over again!!!

We appreciate this is a new way of learning for many within our local churches – but please embrace it and make best use of the resources available to you.

We also understand that people within our local churches may have questions and queries about this new training package. All queries should be directed to Paula Kitson, the new Synod Safeguarding Support Officer. Paula will do her best to answer your questions and she can be contacted via her email address at safeguardingsupport@urcyorkshirenorthern.org.uk

There will no longer be regular Zoom or face to face safeguarding foundation training at a local church level as it is anticipated that people will use the above option to access the training. Again, if you have any queries please direct them to Paula.

Intermediate and other training will continue to be delivered utilising the same methods as we have done over the past 3 years, delivered directly by the synod safeguarding officer.


An opportunity to visit the newly refurbished building and to see the plans for the garden, based on ideas by the late Ruth Crofton Refreshments will be available
