More Jubilee Celebrations

Although the official celebrations and the service at Methodist Central Hall had been postponed on 1st October due to the rail strikes, it has really been encouraging to hear that many of our churches have celebrated the URC's Jubilee in style over the weekend. The creative juices have flowed, from new hymns for us to share to trees being planted to craft gifts being distributed and displayed. As yet I haven't heard when the new national celebration dates will be, but as soon as I know more I'll be letting you all know via The Briefing, via the Website and on our usual social media channels.

So here are a few more of the events that have taken place and I hope that they inspire us all to go out into our communities and celebrate all that the URC has to offer.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS of the URC at Norristhorpe Chapel

On Saturday 8 October a good number of folk gathered in the Chapel for a Concert to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the United Reformed Church. There was a varied and interesting program, mainly made up of local talent who provided music, drama, monologues, a quiz with an appearance from the Norristhorpe Belle Ringers. A good time was had by all, with a great deal of participation and laughter, as well as more serious items. One guest singer was Marilyn from Longcauseway who sang a number of items accompanied by Maryon. Maryon, also played a John Rutter piece on the organ and accompanied our final hymn ('How Great Thou Art' which had also been the answer to one of the questions in the quiz: Which hymn of Swedish origin won the Songs of Praise viewers' favourite vote in 2013 and came second in 2019?!).



The entertainment was followed by refreshments including a wonderful variety of cakes made available by members. There was also a retiring collection that raised a magnificent £147.40p which has been donated to the URCs 'Commitment for Life' scheme (an article on Bangladesh appeared in the Chapel's October Newsletter).

The following day (**Sunday 9 October**) there was a Celebratory Service at Norristhorpe taking as its main theme the 50th Anniversary of the URC. The service was led by Rev Chris Wood, who offered an



explanation to the background of the United Reformed Church, referring to a booklet entitled 'Where do we Come From?' (a copy of which has been provided to the Chapel for those that wanted to explore this subject further). The service concluded with a celebration of Holy Communion. The congregation was also treated to refreshments after the service, which included some of the cakes left over from the day before.

On Saturday 15th October, **Upper Chapel, Idle,** held a Coffee Morning in aid of Macmillan Cancer Research and raised over £500 in just one day. Yorkshire Synod Autumn Meetings




On Saturday 8th October and again on the evening of Thursday 13th October, Yorkshire Synod met for its Autumn meeting.

On the Saturday the meeting was hosted by Bilton Grange URC and those who attended in person were welcomed most warmly. The meeting centred on Yorkshire's Missional Synod initiative, which has been driven by our Mission Advocate, Jon Steel. The three

resolutions covering the outing of God's mission at the heart of our Synod activity, adopting the 5

Threads of Mission and a commitment to ensuring that Synod's ethos is always mission focused were overwhelmingly carried and as Jon put it, the real work of mission starts now.



Recognised Children and Youth Leaders' policy. Introduced by Megan Tillbrook, this piece of work has



been long in the making and will enable those who look to lead the activities for young people in our churches to be recognised formally and with that to be resourced effectively from both the Synod and denomination. Again, this resolution was overwhelmingly carried and the plan is that the policy will be rolled out to all the Yorkshire churches in the weeks and months to come. Finally it was great to have a bookstall back at Synod. Thanks go to Barry Simmons of Brackenhall URC who was able to bring a great selection of items from Christian Books in Huddersfield. who also brought a selection of his own books, poems and hymns for us to share and to the folk at the URC bookshop who sent me various Prayer Diaries, Calendars, histories, worship resources and socks. 
Online Bookings for the 2023 Youth Assembly are now open

Safeguarding News

Safeguarding Foundation Training

The URC's Safeguarding Foundation training can now be accessed online via an e-learning a package. All you need is a device and a connection to the internet which doesn't need to be at home – you can do this training at someone else's home, in a church, in a library, in a coffee shop or even on a bus!!! The training doesn't have to be done in one sitting – you can do it in bite sized chunks, when and where it suits you! At the end of the training there is a short quiz and then you are asked to enter you details. That's it!! You then send a message off to Church House via the press of a button and you will then receive your very own certificate and the records updated that you have completed your training.

Its really easy to do.

All you need to do is to select from one of the options below. There are 3 to chose from – the first two are in relation to what sort of device you are using. The third option is a narrated version where there is no need to read the training – you can just sit back and let someone read it to you. All three work in the same way and have the same conclusion at the end. So all you need to do is to select which option suits you best, move your cursor over the blue coloured link, press the CTRL button your keyboard (which is usually at the bottom left) and press the button on your mouse. That is it. Just complete the training in your own time and wherever you want. All I would suggest that if you are using the narrated option and you are in a public place you may want to use some earphones!!

Some of you may recall, or will have attended, the last URC: Spirituality online event that took place in June (an online quiet day) or the last series of events in January.

Now URC:Spirituality are pleased to be publicising its upcoming online week of events: **"Praying With Those Who Wait"**. This week of free sessions will look at the, perhaps, more unheard areas of Christ's Advent. This will take place in 3 sessions each day, from Tuesday 22nd to Saturday 26th November 2022. Each session is independent so feel free to attend one, some or all of them on Zoom.

A week of online sessions exploring characters and scenarios on the edge of Christ's advent. Hosted by URC:Spirituality. The sessions are independent so feel free to come to one, some or all of them!

Each morning there will be a short morning prayer time to start the day. This is a perfect way to begin your day in a contemplative way, giving whatever you may be up to that day, over to God. At lunchtime we will have a series of sessions run by various people from the URC:Spriituality core group and beyond. Exploring largely unseen characters, or picking up on largely unexplored themes. In the evenings we welcome guest speakers from across the breadth of spirituality as we continue to explore these characters and themes. These will be largely discussion-based and will finish with a short time of prayer to close the day.

The sessions will be held on Zoom, hosted by Media for Ministry. Media for Ministry has had a longstanding friendship with URC:Spirituality. Since first supporting "Streams in the Wilderness" back in May 2021, their expertise and sensitivity makes them a perfect fit with URC:Spirituality.
