


### **Warm Welcomes in Yorkshire**

### **Energy Efficiency and Places of Worship**

Recently we have been receiving a few enquiries from churches asking about how they can reduce their utility bills or how to be more energy efficient. Sadly there is no quick answer, but this useful



page on the Historic England website may hold a few pointers. On the Energy Efficiency and Places of Worship | Historic England site, advice is given on saving energy, reducing heat loss and reducing energy used for heating as well as other hints and tips about maximising what you already have. The office also has a "Save energy, reduce your carbon footprint & keep warm this winter" checklist that is another useful tool to help make your buildings warmer places.

### Winter Warmer Initiative grants from the Yorkshire Synod Mission Fund are still available



The Yorkshire Synod is acutely aware of the challenges facing many people in our communities with the prospect of huge increases in energy bills this winter, and beyond.

We are pleased that some congregations are already responding (and intend to respond) with initiatives to offer warm spaces for their

communities and Synod would like to help with this.

We would encourage congregations (and groups of churches, including ecumenical partners) who are planning such initiatives to apply to the small grants stream of the Synod Mission Fund for help (grants up to £2,500)

To ease the burden and speed of administration the Synod Mission Fund Panel are relaxing our normal procedures for applications as follows:

- Applications can be made at any time directly to the Synod Clerk at <u>clerk@urcyorkshire.org.uk</u>. The applications will then be dealt with between SMF Panel meetings as soon as possible.
- Use and attach the small grants form found at <u>Forms URC Yorkshire Synod</u> ideally this one <u>https://urcyorkshire.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2021/03/181121-Synod-Mission-Fund-SMALLER-grant-application-form.docx</u>
- 3. Please insert the title "Winter Warmer Initiative" followed by the Church (or lead Church) name into the Mission Project Name field on page 1 of the form AND in the e-mail subject field so we can pick up applications quickly.
- 4. Please be very brief in question 1 (Your Project). Some description of what you are doing will be helpful but there is no need for too much detail describing the purpose of your project and how it helps the mission of your church.
- 5. Churches can still apply for an additional grant towards Winter Warmer initiatives even if they already have applications for other projects in train, submitted recently, or planned for the near future.
- 6. Churches can apply if your Winter Warmer initiative has already started.
- 7. We would still like to see indications of offers of match funding plus your latest accounts. Some indication of how your own energy bills are being affected will also be helpful. Insert this in the form at question 3 (How much of this can your church contribute?). Costs of the project for which you request funding must relate directly to the initiative. This includes anticipated additional energy costs but not normal energy costs.
- 8. Applications towards Winter Warmer initiatives can be submitted up to 31st March 2023

We look forward to receiving your applications. Please come back to either the Synod Clerk, Tim Crossley or the Synod Treasurer, Rev Simon Copley via the office with any questions you may have.

You will also be pleased to know that the Yorkshire Synod budget for 2023 includes £100,000 set aside to help churches in Yorkshire with the challenges of their own normal energy costs. This is in addition to £2 million that is being set aside by the URC centrally to help churches in all Synods. The detailed criteria for distributing these central funds is yet to be decided but further updates and other useful information will follow as soon as we have more details.



### **Racial Justice Sunday**

Sunday 12th February 2023 is Racial Justice Sunday and Zaidie Orr, the Synod's Racial Justice Advocate is encouraging all churches to take some time to mark this specific Sunday.

For 2023 the focus will be remembering Stephen Lawrence

The 22nd April 2023 marks the 30th anniversary of the racist killing of Black teenager, Stephen Lawrence, in Eltham, southeast London. In many respects, Racial Justice Sunday is one of the many legacies of Stephen Lawrence's life. As such, in marking Racial Justice Sunday, churches are remembering a young man who in life aspired to be an architect, but whose legacy has seen him become an architect for justice, equality, dignity and unity.

The Racial Justice Sunday Resources are produced by CTBI's sponsoring churches. They will provide readers with opportunities to pray and take action on racial justice-related matters, not only on that Sunday but throughout the year. The link for further information and resources is below.

### The United Reformed Church Waldensian Fellowship

The URC Waldensian Fellowship is planning a visit to the Waldensian Church in Italy, to take place in the period from 4<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> May, 2023.

The visit will be based in comfortable and well situated Church Centres in two areas of Italy. The programme for the visit is as follows:

Firstly a week in the historic Waldensian Valleys in the Cottian Alps, west of Turin, visiting historic sites set in dramatic alpine scenery.

Then a four days at a Waldensian Centre on the Ligurian coast, a few miles from the French border, where we will see something of the Waldensian Church's witness in wider Italian society. We would be delighted if you were interested in joining us for the entire visit, or for one or other of the two parts.

Total cost of the visit (excluding travel to and from Italy) will be around £750. Part One of the visit on its own would cost £400 and Part Two would cost £350.

### YOU'RE WELCOME COURSES

The Education and Learning part of the URC is again running its "You're Welcome" courses again. This year there are two versions of the course, which brings in elements of courses that have run in the past, in particular "Ethos and History" and "What is the URC?".

- 1) The Zoom sessions which take place from **Friday 9 Saturday 10 June 2023**. These sessions are for accepted candidates entering EM1, and are in fact mandatory for them. Over the last 2 years, however, we have extended the invitation to new Church House and Synod admin staff, and also Assembly Accredited Lay Preachers.
- 2) The residential course at Westminster College, Cambridge, which runs from lunch on **Monday 2 October through to mid-morning on Wednesday 4 October 2023**. This course has always been for ordained ministers of other denominations working in Local Ecumenical Partnerships and also for those on Certificates of Eligibility. In recent years we have also invited Assembly Accredited Lay Preachers, AALP trainees and new Synod field staff eg Training Officers and CYDOs. The sessions are led by staff and resource persons from the URC and Westminster College. Please note there is a **fee** for this course (£150 last year and the year before) and this fee, plus the delegates' travel expenses, should be covered by their URC synod.

Both versions of the course include sessions on the history of the URC, what it means to be part of the URC and its mission today, and how to be intergenerational and intercultural.


#### **Higher Education**
