CORONATION SPECIAL

As you will all know, King Charles III will be crowned on Saturday May 6th. Some churches are celebrating in style, others are being the focal point for their local community activities, whilst others will be looking at the spiritual nature of this ceremony. Many of us will be reflecting on what crowning involves, what its significance is and how it relates to us as (in the main) citizens of the United Kingdom and perhaps, more importantly, to us as Christians.

For me, when I hear the word coronation, wierdly my mind heads down a cobbled street to the Kabin, with the sound of a lone trumpet playing a melancholy tune, as I look for a chicken meat dish made from an Indian inspired creamy curry sauce, or, as it should be, my mind is drawn to these words of Matthew Bridges:

1 Crown him with many crowns,
the Lamb upon his throne.
Hark! how the heavenly anthem drowns
all music but its own.
Awake, my soul, and sing
of him who died for thee,
and hail him as thy matchless king
through all eternity.

2 Crown him the Lord of life, who triumphed o'er the grave, and rose victorious in the strife for those he came to save; his glories now we sing who died and rose on high, who died eternal life to bring, and lives that death may die.

3 Crown him the Lord of love; behold his hands and side, rich wounds, yet visible above, in beauty glorified; no angels in the sky can fully bear that sight, but downward bends their burning eye at mysteries so bright.

ineffably sublime.
All hail, Redeemer, hail!
for thou hast died for me;
thy praise shall never, never fail
throughout eternity.

General Assembly 2023



The General Assembly of the United Reformed Church will take place between 30th June and 3rd July at The Hayes Conference Centre in Swanwick, Derbyshire. Each Synod is able to send 16 representatives, comprising ministers and lay people including 2 'under-25s'. We are particularly looking for any lay people who would like to be involved this year as it affords an opportunity to be involved in discussions about the current and future work of the church, and to listen to varied speakers and

conversations. YOU'RE WELCOME COURSES

The Education and Learning part of the URC is again running its "You're Welcome" courses again. This year there are two versions of the course, which brings in elements of courses that have run in the past, in particular "Ethos and History" and "What is the URC?"

- 1) The Zoom sessions which take place from Friday 9 Saturday 10 June 2023. These sessions are for accepted candidates entering EM1, and are in fact mandatory for them. Over the last 2 years, however, we have extended the invitation to new Church House and Synod admin staff, and also Assembly Accredited Lay Preachers.
- 2) The residential course at Westminster College, Cambridge, which runs from Junch on Monday 2
 October through to mid-morning on Wednesday 4 October 2023. This course has always been for ordained ministers of other denominations working in Local Ecumenical Partnerships and also for those on Certificates of Eligibility. In recent years we have also invited Assembly Accredited Lay Preachers, AALP trainees and new Synod field staff e.g. Training Officers and CYDOs. The sessions are led by staff and resource persons from the URC and Westminster College. Please note there is a fee for this course (£150 last year and the year before) and this fee, plus the delegates' travel expenses, should be covered by their URC synod.

Both versions of the course include sessions on the history of the URC, what it means to be part of the URC and its mission today, and how to be intergenerational and intercultural. SYNOD FORUM – Coming soon

Gift Aid claims on digital donations

Churches and chapels that have installed card-readers to take casual donations by visitors should note the following: HMRC has issued new **guidance** which states: "Donations made using digital platforms, credit card or debit card may incur an administration fee which reduces the actual amount received by the charity. Subject to the normal qualifying conditions, *the gross donation paid is eligible for Gift Aid*, regardless of any processing fees incurred by the charity. The charity may treat these administrative fees as charitable expenditure. Where the charity is unable to demonstrate a clear audit trail of administration fees incurred Gift Aid should only be claimed on the net donation received" [our emphasis].

This might be an opportunity to claim more Gift Aid.





Yorkshire Synod Discipleship Development Grant funds 2023

In the last few issues of the Briefing I have highlighted the fact that the Small Grants fund pot for 2023 was open for individuals looking for support towards their training. I'm happy to let you all know that the Large Grant fund pot is now open for churches and groups to apply to to enable them to offer development on a wider scale.

The **Discipleship Development Funds** are intended to contribute to the development of lay people and therefore the purposes for which it can be used are as broad as can be generated by creativity and vocation, in line with the aims of the URC's Discipleship Development Strategy (DDS), which are to equip the people of the United Reformed Church to:

- Create opportunities for everyone to encounter the living God, whether they already identify themselves as followers of Christ or not.
- Encourage everyone in their prayer life and relationship with God to enable them to live as disciples of Jesus.
 - Encourage everyone to make the most of education opportunities that are relevant and appropriate for them in their discipleship journey.

The eligible costs would include, without being restricted to:

- National or denominational learning events, conferences or programmes developed in-house;
- Personnel costs;
- Courses (at any level) at any of the United Reformed Church Resource Centres for Learning or other suitable learning providers;
- Books, equipment and resources related to a particular topic or activity;
- Attendance at Synod learning events; and
- Travel costs for attending learning events.




