The '5 threads' weave together to give an overall picture of mission. We can use them to think about mission in our own lives, our churches and Synod:



Pray. Give thanks that you have been invited to join in God's mission in the world. Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your thoughts and discussions as you seek ways to grow in mission.



1. Think about what your church does. Try to make a list of the different activities you run, or spend your time on. You could also think about what you spend your time and money on.



2. Review your list. Can you identify which things fit one (or more) of the five threads. It is good to see that we are already doing 'missional' things. It is also good to be honest in our reflections. For example, we might think our Sunday worship is a time when people are invited to 'meet with God'. But how many non-Christians actually attend, and how easy is it for them to understand or to join in?

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
3. Look again at your list. Are there things that don't fit any of the threads, but they could do, with a bit of adaptation or change? For example, you might be running a Messy Church, while another church is also running one down the road. Is there any scope in partnering with each other (perhaps sharing resources, co-ordinating dates, or publicising each other's events), to provide more opportunities?



4. Finally, look at the five mission threads themselves, and ask honestly, if there are any you might not be very strong in? Ask God what things you might do to develop in those areas. The synod team can help you with this, with ideas, or mentoring or coaching support.



Take time to pray again. Thank God for what you might have noticed. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to see where you might develop.



In Yorkshire Synod, we see our mission as 5 threads that weave together. These 5 threads describe the things we do to join in God's mission in the world, as witnesses to Jesus in our words and in our actions.

## Building justice and peace, and healing creation

Do we speak out about how the weakest and most vulnerable are treated in our world? What do we do to protect and steward creation?
