DEALING WITH FINANCES

We are aware that a lot of older people who are struggling to get to cash points or out to shops are often giving their debit cards to members of the church. Obviously this opens people up to potential allegations and the potential for fraudulent activity. We want to ensure that everyone is vigilant to the possibilities of financial abuse and we want to protect members of the church where possible.

Any matters where money is exchanged is down to those involved, however we would like to suggest the following guidance.

If you are asked to provide cash from your own account in exchange for a bank transfer then you may wish to sit with the person who is transferring the money whilst they make the transaction before the cash is handed to them.

Please ensure receipts are provided for cash that is removed from another person' account using their debit card. You may wish to take another person to the cash point with you for enhanced transparency.

Please make someone in the church aware if you are being asked to use someone else's bank card to withdraw cash for them.

Consider setting up a "Pre-pay" debit card (in the name of the carer) specifically for this purpose. The individual or their family could transfer an amount of money onto the card which the carers could then use on their behalf. This would stop the carer having potential access to all the individual's funds and also make everything more transparent as everything spent on that card would be for that purpose (not mixed in with other finances). Tesco Bank does such a card with no monthly fees.
