


#### **Yorkshire Synod**

#### RURAL MISSION

The URC nationally are looking for someone in each Synod to be part of a **Rural regional network.** Ideally that person should be:

- well connected & able to network locally (lay or ordained)
- involved in rural mission & ministry (not necessarily in an agricultural chaplaincy role)
- keen to support, encourage & resource local rural congregations (eg pass on the summary info notes 4 x per year) as well as represent them at national level

We meet as an ecumenical group for an hour four times per year (Thursdays daytime) online to share encouragement, resources, pray together & also engage with input on a topical rural issue or subject. Emails in between times are kept to a minimum.



'The Conference is a wonderful opportunity to meet with URC folks from various places to learn


together about how much God loves us and wants us to share that love in practical, doable and life affirming ways.'

#### **And Finally**

#### **South Leeds fits EV Charger to Manse**

We have a bit of an Eco theme emerging here as we have received news that The URC in South Leeds has fitted an Electric Vehicle Charger to their Manse.

Although their manse is currently rented out, the church took control of the situation and organised the installation rather than allowing the tenant to arrange things as the property did require an electrical upgrade. This upgrade was done by the Utility Provider, in their case Northern Power Grid, and it was done at no expense to either the tenant or the church.

Kindly, Janet Howse, of the URC in South Leeds, has offered a point by point guide as to how they did it, hopefully to inspire other churches who have manses or even to us in our own houses.

- 1. Contact an electrician (who is qualified for these type of installations) not all are.
- 2. Electrician advised that the church would need the MPAN number, which they found on their Utility Provider's bills.
- 3. Once the MPAN number is passed on to the Power Provider (by the electrician) the Power Provider have around a fortnight in which to respond after which time if the information has not been forthcoming the Utility Provider incur fines.
- 4. This will then be followed by a visit from the Power Provider to ascertain if the existing fuse box was sufficient to meet the demand. In our case it wasn't so an electrical upgrade was done by the Power Provider at no charge to the church.
- 5. This was followed by a site visit from the electrician to determine where to site and to provide full cost.
- 6. Actual installation.

For The URC in South Leeds the total cost of the actual installation to the church has been just over £1,000.00 inclusive of VAT which included the electrician's fees and the cost of the charger and took in the region of two months to complete. The URC in South Leeds hopes this little guide helps, should others within Synod want to move forward with the installation of an EV charging point within their manses.
