AUTUMN SYNOD SPECIAL




This weekend sees the Yorkshire Synod meeting at Christchurch Ilkley for its autumn meeting. Gathering there on Saturday morning at 10.15am, church representatives from across the Synod will join in fellowship to discern the journey God has for us in Synod through the stories and presentations given by our speakers and through the resolutions that are to be moved.

At the heart of the meeting will be the call to serve, be it through pioneering ministry, intentional communities and individual calls to discipleship through the URC's Stepwise programme. Furthermore, mention will be made of the way in which Synod's own journey has been shaped by the 5 Threads of Mission it adopted a couple of years ago and which is regularly alluded to in the Briefing. All are welcome at this meeting, and although the formal decisions lie in those representatives chosen by individual churches,

contributions are welcomed. If you are unable to get to Ilkley on Saturday, please pray that the



Thankfully, Becky is clear after two rounds of chemotherapy (one more to go) but many are not so fortunate. The survival rate from this form of cancer is not high. Please help Simon's






