New Year and New Names

There are some changes afoot in Synod which will mean that the New Year brings some new names to the Synod. The New Year has also brought in some new technology, not least a new laptop for the Clerk, who is slowly coming to terms with the fact that although the keyboard looks the same, the Clerk's fingers don't necessarily land on the letters he is wanting to use. I'm sure that there are some biblical parallels here, but I will leave that to those who are more adept in that particualr field. So in terms of new names, you will see that the Elders' Development Group are going through a bit of a re-branding, so that their annual conference being held on 22nd March wil be known as the "Annual Mathetes Conference". Now I'm no biblical or Greek scholar, but in Greek, a follower of Jesus is called a mathētēs. This word is used across a considerable number of early writings, from the gospels included in the New Testament (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) to the Book of Acts and other early writings like the Apocryphon of John (Secret Revelation of John). So a mathētēs is a student, which we all are as we continue on our Christian journey.

Another new name that we will be seeing is that of Tony Harris, who will be joining us as the Wilderness Youth worker in the "N.O.W." group of churches. The churches in the Nidd, Ouse and Wharfe group have come together with the Synod's Children & Youth Work committee and have appointed Tony as their new Youth, Children and Family Enabler. He officially starts on Monday 27th January and I hope to be able to bring a profile in the next issue of the Briefing.

The other new name that we would love to be able to bring to you is that of a new Trust Officer. As I mentioned last year, our current Trust Officer, Alastair, retires at the end of March and although we tried to recruit a successor at the back end of last year, we were unsuccessful. Nevertheless, we continue to look and the details of how to apply are on both the Synod website and in the advert below. If you know of anyone who may be interested, please encourage them to apply. Finally a further call for folk to help in the running of Synod. We are always looking for people to help in the mission and direction of Synod and the URC in general. DBS Barring Functions and the Legal Duty to Refer

This free Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) workshop is for those within the faith sector and will provide insight and guidance into the DBS Barring functions and when an organisation refers a staff member or volunteer to DBS following safeguarding concerns.

Key items that will be covered include:

- •how DBS and those within the faith sector can work together to safeguard vulnerable groups
- •what 'Regulated Activity' is
- •when a DBS barring referral should be made, including when the legal duty is met
- •the three different referral routes
- •how to make a good quality referral
- •the consequences of not making appropriate barring referrals
- •the consequences of being included on one or both Barred Lists

The workshop will be presented live by the DBS Adviser for Yorkshire & The Humber.



someone might remember Gregory Bates or his family but unfortunately they have not yet found anyone who does.

However, Elder Susan Carter, has been in touch with a family with longstanding roots at Idle and has received this order of service for that day in April 1956 and a photo of one of the hammers "in action". This was shared with the church by Stewart Roberts, the little boy in the photo seen here with his father, Geoffrey Roberts, a long



passed onto the folk at Upper Chapel, Idle in due course. These hammers were given to the children of the Sunday School who each laid a stone at a special ceremony when the 4th Upper Chapel was being built in 1956. The church is aware that some local people still have their hammers but were surprised to learn that one had ended up in Glasgow. The church put a post on one of their local Facebook groups (Idle Memories Past and Present) which has eight thousand members who live or have lived in Idle in the hope that
