Synod to meet and Yorkshire Churches get busy

As you may have gathered, the Spring meeting of the Yorkshire Synod will be taking place on Saturday 8th March at Heckmondwike URC. This is the first time I ever remember the Synod meeting there, so I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Members and Elders at Heckmondwike for extending the invitation to meet at their place and I hope that we can do them proud by attending the meeting in whatever role you hold. This invitation to join is all the more poignant in that we will not be streaming the meeting, so all the activities will be on-site, although I have heard that the October meeting may be more digitally accessible. However, I'll give a report of the meeting in the next issue of the Briefing due out on 13th March.

I have been bowled over by all the e-mails letting me know of all the activities that have been happening around Synod. 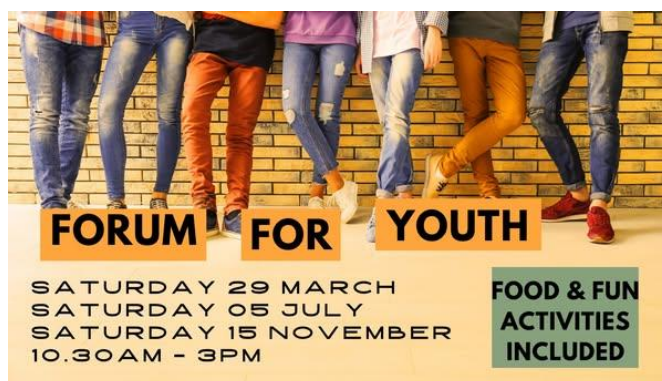

Please follow this format, and feel free to submit a prayer yourself or share across your networks. Prayers received anytime between now and 28 February would be greatly appreciated.

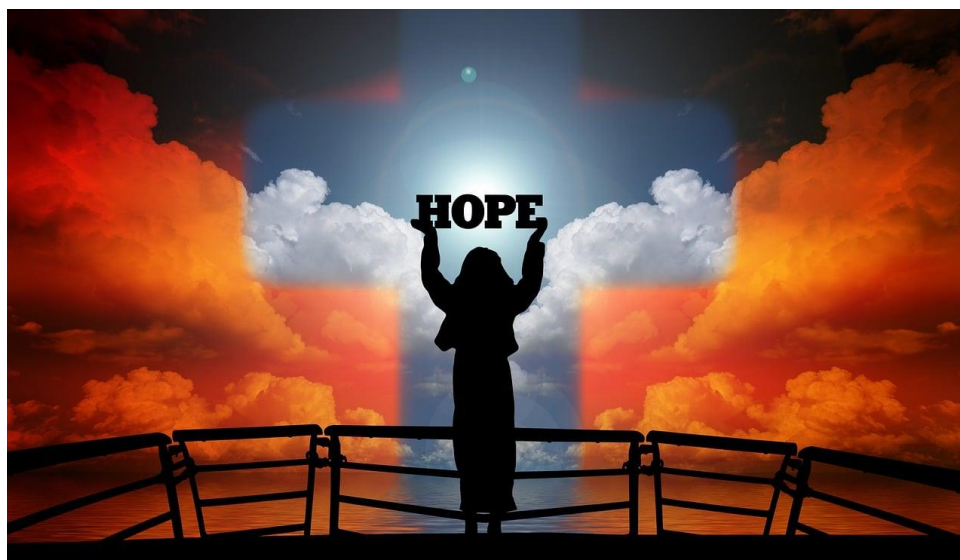

World Poetry Day events in the Hull Area Team churches

The Hull Area Team of churches are marking World Poetry Day this year with a series of events that will thrill poetry lovers from across the city and the East Riding.

Each congregation will play host to a different talented writer – each bringing their own unique verbal skills to an eager audience.

On Thursday 20th March Zion URC in Cottingham will play host to Paul Cookson, the poet in residence for the National Football Museum and the “poet laureate” for the rock band Slade. Paul is a veteran performer with dozens of books to his name and a good line in jokes and music too. Paul is well known for his fun, family friendly shows and will definitely bring the laughter with him.



On Friday 21st March (World Poetry Day) St Ninian’s & St Andrew’s on Chanterlands Avenue in Hull will explore the complicated legacy of ‘Hull’s Most Famous Librarian’ in an event marking 70 years since the publication of Philip Larkin’s volume ‘The Less Deceived’. Stewart Henderson, a celebrated poet and feted broadcaster will celebrate the Larkin legacy while the evening will also feature young people from Wyke Sixth Form college.



On Saturday 22nd March Christ Church in Swanland will welcome Adrian and Bridget Plass who are set to bring an ‘evening of laughter and tears.’ Adrian Plass, the writer of the enormously popular ‘Sacred Diary’ series among a host of other (more recent) books will bring his trademark wit and wisdom as he and Bridget explore a series of stories and poems in this event which may have you rolling in your seats, but won’t leave a dry eye in the house.

Each event will begin at 7pm and tickets are priced at £8/£5

The team minister, Revd Dr Simon Cross, said: “Each of our churches sits in a unique community – the range of poets we’re hosting reflects the variety of people who live in and around the different congregations.”

As well as performing in Zion in the evening Paul Cookson will be leading a poetry workshop in the local high school in the day time, while the World Poetry Day celebration at St Ninian’s & St Andrew’s will feature support from the Philip Larkin Society and the voices of young people from the nearby Wyke Sixth Form college. The event in Swanland is set to be an ecumenical celebration, as members from the other churches in the village join neighbours and friends in enjoying the work of the beloved Christian writer.

Discipleship Development Fund Deadline

Philippa Linton, the administrator for the denomination's Education & Learning committee has sent the following to remind us of the upcoming deadline of 31st March for applications for **Discipleship Development Fund Large Grants**.

For the Large Grant, around £5,000 per award per year is available to recognised groups within the URC. Grants can be put towards any purpose that will contribute to the Discipleship Development of lay people in or connected with the URC. Multi-year projects can be supported for up to three years and a tapered approach to funding is encouraged. Applications for grants that only partially fund a project are acceptable, but the application will need to identify the source of the other funds. Any recognised group can apply, but if the group applying is not an Assembly Committee or a Synod, it will need to gain approval for its application from their Assembly Committee or Synod. Applicants need to clearly demonstrate how the grant will be used to develop discipleship and lifelong learning within the URC. That means that it needs to be approved by our Yorkshire Synod Ministries Committee, and to do so, please drop a line to them via office@urcyorkshire.org.uk.

Over the past few years, the DDFLGAG (Discipleship Development Fund Large Grants Award Group) has awarded grants to a variety of projects encouraging people's discipleship across the URC. These include:

- Funding for a Children's and Family Worker in Birmingham
- Funding for a Discipleship Development Worker at Cheltenham URC
- Two 'Leading Your Church into Growth' conferences run by the five northerly Synods
- Two retreat days run by the Leeds URC Partnership Retreat for churches across the Partnership
- Funding to take a youth group from Thamesmead to a Christian festival
- A Worship and Bible Hub in North Wales
- 'Faithful Flourishing Day' in Northern Synod
- A 3-year initiative supporting the discipleship of Trans and Gender Non-conforming people in Oxford
- Funding for marginalised and minoritised families and individuals to attend the URC Holiday Forum
- A World Poetry Day in Hull, to encourage the discipleship of local church people

Delegated Hiring Authority

This is a brief note of advice to all you Church Secretaries out there. Some time ago, in 2017, the Yorkshire Congregational Union (Inc) were advised that legally they are responsible for any hiring of church premises to third parties. Accordingly, churches were invited to accept delegated authority from the Trust for temporary, occasional or intermittent third party hiring.

For those who accepted, this means that the authority for hiring your premises has been delegated to your Elders, and the YCU requires a six-monthly return of hirings (to June 30th and December 31st each year).

We are quite short on returns at present, so if your church has not already completed its return, I hope that it can be completed and returned to us at the earliest convenience. If you require a reminder of how to do it and the forms that are used, please contact our Trust officer at trust@urcyorkshire.org.uk.
