
Not only that, the church is benefitting from a simple request to take some internal photographs of our church. Back in 2024, Dr. Simon Ross Valentine visited the church to take photographs for a book he was writing on the churches of Bradford. During a conversation with one of the Elders it emerged that Simon is also a Methodist Lay Preacher. Online Quiet Day: Playing with God

27 September 2025 10:30am to 4:00pm

Venue: Online, Ticket: Free

Led by Leslie Bailey -(opening prayers),
Mark Argent and Ann Barton, and Jane Weedon (closing prayers).



The day draws its theme from part of the gospel for 27 September, which records Jesus predicting his death (again) and saying to the disciples: "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest."

For some that carries an invitation to come to God "like a child" — which could be heard as "praying with one's inner child". For others that can feel like a more difficult space — particularly if there are uncomfortable memories or associations to childhood.

In biblical times those words could have been heard quite differently — perhaps as a challenge to the idea that power gets someone closer to God (or God is on the side of the powerful).

The invitation of the day is to spend some time in prayer away from our screens, and in discussion with others, to attend to what God may be saying to us.

The <u>readings for the day</u> are Psalm 91:1-6, 14-16; Jeremiah 24:1-10 and Luke 9:43b-48. For this quiet day we'll focus on the gospel:

43b And they were all amazed at the greatness of God. While everyone was marvelling at all that Jesus did, he said to his disciples, 44 "Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you: The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men." 45 But they did not understand what this meant. It was hidden from them, so that they did not grasp it, and they were afraid to ask him about it. 46 An argument started among the disciples as to which of them would be the greatest. 47 Jesus, knowing their thoughts, took a little child and had him stand beside him. 48 Then he said to them, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest."



This Autumn's Synod has a different feel about it as we are doing it in two parts. On the evening of Thursday 9th October we will be discussing the financial aspect of Synod life via Zoom, then on Saturday 11th October at St Andrew's, Roundhay we look at the missional, justice and youth engagement aspect of our Synod's life.

There are three workshops available and we invite Synod Representatives to join two of them during the day. They are:

Exploring Life, Love and Faith with Gen Z – Matthew Willmott, Frontier Youth Trust

Each generation understands the world slightly differently than the one before. How are Gen Z understanding life stages and in particular, what it means to be in a relationship? How can the church support, challenge and walk alongside young people as they make their way in the world? This is just the starting point of a conversation that we need to be open to having.

Discipleship in Divided Times - Joint Public Issues Team (JPIT)


How might Christians engage in a political and social mainstream that is shifting into more populist and openly far-right views and expression? How can our conversations with friends and family reflect a sensitivity to these influences, build trust across difference yet challenge extreme-right policies that undermine democracy and Christian values? The Joint Public Issues Team will lead a workshop highlighting current trends in society, the impact these have on the most vulnerable, and how Christians can engage effectively in changing times.

The Gift of Presence: How children and young people can transform church life – Tony Harris and Tracey Winfrow

What difference does it make when children and young people are truly part of the life of the church—not just present, but participating, shaping, and belonging? This workshop invites you to explore how the presence of young people can breathe new life, perspective, and purpose into your church community. Through stories, reflection, and discussion, we'll uncover the theological, relational, and missional impact of engaging younger generations. Whether your church is growing with young people or longing for their return, this session will challenge and encourage you to see them not as the church of tomorrow, but as vital members of the church today.

Everyone will be able to attend 2 of the 3 on offer and choices can be made on the day, but we hope that by providing this information in advance, churches and synod representatives can share, discuss and consider their options. Those who are not synod representatives, but with an interest in the topics may also wish to attend. Everyone is welcome to come along and there will be creche facilities (unsupervised, in the main meeting hall) for babies and small children.




Yorkshire Synod Discipleship Development Small Grant Fund 2025


FIRE SAFETY

Messy Mondays and New Places for New People in Beverley

One of the joys about being Synod Clerk is that I get to see so much good work being done through our churches, from the Pennines to the North Sea, from the Dales to the seven hills of Sheffield. One example of a project being part funded by the Synod Mission Fund is the Messy Monday project at Toll Gavel church in Beverley.



Messy Mondays is a weekly playgroup run in term time for babies and pre-school children. It is an outreach group supported by Church volunteers and staff for the benefit of the community. It is well established having been running for 40 plus years. The aim of the group is to connect local families to the Church, by providing an inviting playgroup in the Church building. Their welcoming group gives families a sense of belonging and connection with Church

as they enjoy the play group facilities and supportive relationships with the play group staff and volunteers.

Toll Gavel Church also runs New Places for New People, which happens in parallel with Messy Mondays and they successfully appointed a Pioneer Pastor in August 2025. The vision to form a new worshipping community is being developed with a focus on young families within the Beverley & Hull

Mission Area, evolving from a strong base of parents, carers, and families involved in thriving toddler and youth groups across four local churches. The shape and structure of this new Christian community are intentionally being kept flexible, allowing the community and a future pioneer lay pastor to co-create its direction. Their current children and family worker and playworker welcome children and caregivers to this new missional initiative.
