ADVENT IS HERE

Advent is nearly here; it starts this Sunday on 30th November and many of the new invitations and events which are in this issue of the Briefing are related to just that or to the Christmas celebrations that Advent leads us into. There are a wide variety of events, ranging from the celebratory to the creative to the contemplatative. Each has its place in our preparation and each has a side which strengthens our understanding of just what we celebrate at Christmas as Christians. As you will see there are special Advent Carol Services, Workshops to help make the decorations for your own celebrations, Christmas Tree Festivals as well as new notices of traditional Carol concerts and services across the Synod.

As well as the Synod churches being active during Advent, so are some of the national interest groups. December 2025. Yes, I know, a Wednesday, but it means that I can still showcase those preChristmas events that I know you are itching to get me to advertise.



Annual Online EVANGELISCHE KIRCHE DER PFALZ Advent Service




The annual online Advent service with the URC's partner churches in the Pfalz region of Germany will be on Sunday evening, 14th

Important information from the Synod Safeguarding Team



Due to changes in the insurance industry, insurers are now adding a new safeguarding endorsement for churches to complete when their insurance is due for renewal. What this means is that insurance companies will now place conditions on all policies, that it these conditions must be adhered to for the policies to be valid.

What this means is that you will need to answer yes to the following questions –

- Have you a complete and comprehensive written safeguarding policy that is reviewed at least annually?
- Do you have a church safeguarding coordinator for your church?
- Do you as a church, provide safeguarding training to everyone who needs it due to their role within the church?
- Do you know how to respond to a safeguarding incident, know who to report it to and how to deal with it correctly?
- Has everyone who needs them, due to their role, had the correct level of DBS checks and has this been completed in the past three years?
- Have you and do you have a system to securely retain records of any abuse allegations and the action you took in relation to these allegations?

You would also need to make the insurance company aware if there have been any allegations of abuse which have been reported at your church.

The above relates to anybody involved in the church who works unsupervised with children or vulnerable adults or has unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults. This means that everybody who falls under the guidance of Good Practice 6, which includes Elders etc need to make sure everything is up to date and in order, to be able to confirm this with the insurance company when the renewal is submitted.

If the answer is no, or the disclosure is incorrectly completed, insurance may be withheld or be made void in any claims. If this is the case and a claim is made it will be made against the church itself and the Trustees.

Many of you may already be able to answer yes to all the questions posed.

However, many of you may not be able to answer yes to all the questions and this is where action needs to be taken at the church.

The Elders/Trustees are responsible for ensuring that the church is a safe place for everyone and therefore responsible for making sure that you can answer all the questions posed by an insurance company to provide insurance cover for the church and everyone who attends. If you need help making sure your church can answer yes to all the questions you will be asked please contact the Synod Safeguarding Team by email (click here) and we will assist you in making sure your church can be insured correctly.

The Safeguarding team are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and 365 days a year (and even 366 days in Leap Years!!). 
A Peaceful time in Denholme

Last time I highlighted the Remembrance poppies knitted by the dextrous fingers of the members of St Andrew's Scarborough. This time I am pleased to highlight the Doves for Peace project at one of our most westerly (if not highest at 290 m above sea level) churches at Denholme. Janice Le Blancq, one of Denholme's Elders, writes:



Peace is a significant word in the Christian vocabulary. We refer to Jesus Christ as the Prince of Peace; we refer to the Peace that passes all understanding; we share The Peace, there is an Advent candle for Peace. The list goes on ...

At a time when there is so much conflict and the world is crying out for Peace, Denholme Shared Church decided to focus on Peace this year. From the end of May throughout June, we joined in with the Bradford City of Culture 2025 celebrations. We were fortunate to receive a small grant and a stunning display



Individuals were asked to consider what Peace meant to them as individuals. It is common to despair and sigh when faced with the troubles of the world but, sometimes, so much more difficult to be at Peace within ourselves and with others.



A rolling slideshow of images with famous quotes on peace was produced and many people commented on how restful and calm they felt for having experienced the exhibition.

The magnificent indoor display will remain in place until at least the New Year but the outdoor doves have now been removed.
Remembrance Sunday has just been observed and we are rapidly drawing towards Advent. Let us hope that the Spirit of Peace will be with us all and the memories of our Doves for Peace Exhibition remain in the hearts of all those who took part.
