## From the Clerk

The lead up to Easter is a period where a greeting such as happy or merry may not be particularly appropriate. With this Briefing being uploaded to the website on Maundy Thursday it comes between two of the high points in our Christian calendar, but the week in which we are in, Holy Week, pulls at our emotions in every which way. We have readily joined in the Hosannas of Palm Sunday and we will enthusiastically shout out the Alleluias on Easter Sunday. Yet during the week we watch and listen to Jesus in the Temple overturning tables and stalls; debating with the theologians and academics of the time; explaining the Kingdom to his followers; and initiating the sacrament of Holy Communion which we still celebrate today. We will read those stories and try to understand and learn from them, then we will read the narrative of Jesus' betrayal, trial, abandonment, death and burial which can never be regarded as happy or merry. So, by Saturday we are in theological maelstrom. There is so much to take in that to try and do it in a week is nigh on impossible.

But we do take it in, and on Easter Sunday it all comes together where we do shout out Alleluia, we can greet each other with a "Christ is Risen, He is risen indeed!" and we can celebrate that the words of Jesus related in John 12:46 do ring true for us all:

***"I have come into the world as light, so that no one who has faith in me should remain in darkness."***

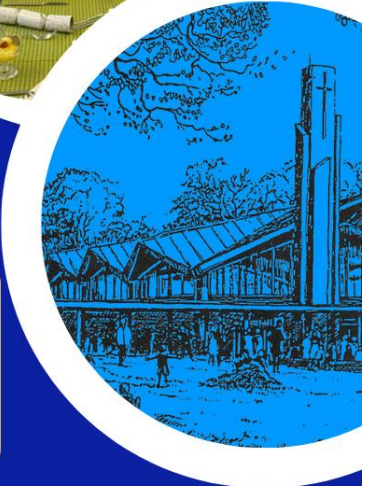

## New Head of Children, Youth and Intergenerational Discipleship

The URC's Faith in Action Team is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr Jo Griffiths as the new Head of Children, Youth and Intergenerational Discipleship (CYID).

Jo, who will begin her new role on 1 July, joins the United Reformed Church from Ridley Hall, Cambridge, where she served as Director of Studies and Children's and Family Ministry Tutor. She brings more than 30 years' experience in youth work to her new role.

The Revd Jenny Mills, Deputy General Secretary (Faith in Action), said: "We are delighted to welcome Jo into the team. She brings a wealth of experience to the role, working with children and young people and those that work with them."

Jo holds a PHD from Brunel University, where her research explored the professional identity formation of newly graduated Christian youth workers. Her MA, also from Brunel University, was in Youth and Community Studies. Jo has a BA (Hons) in Youth and Community Work with Applied Theology from Oxford Brookes University. She is also JNC-qualified (Joint Negotiating Committee for Youth and Community Workers).

Before joining Ridley, Jo worked in churches as a children and youth worker, with a particular passion for developing intergenerational worship and community-focused initiatives. She also worked within local authority youth services, managing teams and creating programmes that supported young people facing adversity. Across all her roles, her heart has remained the same: helping people flourish and building communities where children, young people and adults genuinely belong.

Jo first joined Ridley Hall in 2005 as Assistant Centre Director at what was then the Centre for Youth Ministry (CYM), becoming Centre Director in 2010. She later served as Director of a children, youth and families project based at St Andrew's Church, Enfield, before returning to Ridley in 2020.

Jo said: "I am absolutely thrilled to be stepping into this new role, and I am really looking forward to meeting everyone."

In her free time, enjoys spending time holidays in Somerset and walking across Exmoor. Jo has three grown-up children and lives in North London with her husband Steve, a vicar, and their dog, Jess. During the vacancy period, the CYID and the CYDO+ teams will work together to oversee the ongoing work.

## Yorkshire Synod Discipleship Development Small Grant Fund 2026

The Synod is pleased to let you all know that it has received confirmation that it has a pot of £4000 to grant to those wishing to apply to the Yorkshire Synod Discipleship Development 2026.

1. Who is eligible to apply? Committed members or adherents, including children and young people, of a congregation within the United Reformed Church who are exercising, or want to exercise, a form of lay ministry or community service whether expressed within or beyond their local church. The DDF is not open to Ministers of Word and Sacraments and CRCWs, as there are other designated funds available for those groups.
2. How much is available? Up to £300 per applicant per calendar year, although the Synod may agree to more than this according to the local context and circumstances.
3. What can this money be used for? The purposes for which the funding is provided are defined by creativity and vocation, in line with the URC's discipleship development strategy. Be bold, take risks. The funding exists to help you to follow Jesus. You might be helped in this by courses (at any level) at any of the URC Resource Centres for Learning or from other learning providers, or you may have ideas on resourcing discipleship development in other people. You may need funds to cover the costs of travel, materials or books. All you have to do is make a case to your local church meeting and submit the application form to the Synod Convenor of Ministries for consideration and, if appropriate, authorisation.
4. How are applications made? Having gained your church meeting's endorsement, applications are to be made on the designated form, well before the spending is due to start. Backdated applications will not normally be accepted. Application forms are obtainable from the Synod Convenor of Ministries via the Synod Office at [office@urcyorkshire.org.uk](mailto:office@urcyorkshire.org.uk) and should be sent back for authorisation before being passed to the synod finance office.
5. How are grants paid? Grants authorised by the Convenor of Synod Ministries are paid by a Synod finance officer by reimbursement to you when you have given proof of what you've spent. Contact your Synod Convenor of Ministries for discussion if you need something funded directly on your behalf, rather than waiting for re-imburement.

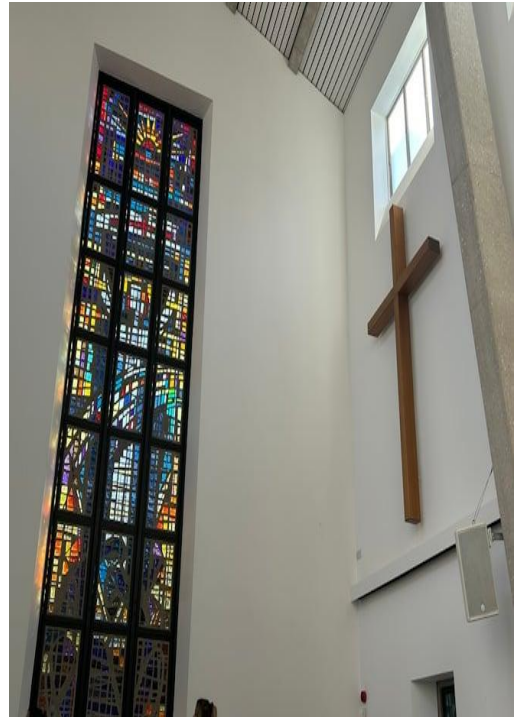
